WAITOC and the Swan Valley Visitor Centre invite Noongar Whadjuk artists to enter submissions that extend a Welcome to Country through art. A winning artwork will be selected from the entries by a panel of judges, with the artist of the selected piece receiving a prize of \$1,500.

New and existing artwork submissions welcome.

We invite all Whadjuk artists to tell their story of Country through their art. Artists with existing artwork that tells a story of Country are also encouraged to enter. Artworks can be supplied as digital images or painted pieces. The chosen artwork will be scanned, digitised and modified to fit if required.

The Theme

We are seeking new or existing artwork which will feature as a decorative 'Welcome to Country' design on the wall of the Swan Valley Visitor Centre reception area at Meadow Street &, Swan Street, Guildford. This is the first port of call for many visitors to the region. The artwork will extend a traditional welcome and story which visually illustrates that the region, now known as Swan Valley, sits within a landscape that has been home to the Noongar Whadjuk people for over 60,000 years.

The Artwork

The artwork must be open to modification, if required, to incorporate the Welcome to Country message and to fit the ceiling space featured on the design specifications on the following page. It will need to contain flexible design elements.

You can enter one or more pieces of artwork. You can submit your work as

- 1) A JPEG photo of a painting or drawing a low res image is fine*.
- *The winning entry will be photographed in high resolution at a later date
- 2) A digital design image (this will need to be a high res JPEG of at least 15MB)

Please include a brief story/description of each art piece.

The artwork must be original work and the sole intellectual property of the artist. It must not carry any copyright agreements with any third parties at the time of entry and for the duration of the competition.

The Agreement

The entries will be judged by an independent panel, based solely on their artistic merit. The winning applicant will receive a prize of \$1500 and will be featured at the launch and other related promotions by WAITOC and the WA Visitor Centre.

The successful artist will enter into a contract agreement with WAITOC, stating that the original artwork and design copyright is shared with WAITOC, allowing the artwork to be used in future WAITOC promotions. Unsuccessful entries will remain the property of the artists.




Things to consider
